CVM Student Doctors, Oren Ofer (DVM 2018) and Jimmy Popp (DVM 2018) recently placed 3<sup>rd</sup> at VetPrep's inaugural <u>The Idea Innovation Competition</u> held at the 2017 Student Chapter of the American Veterinary Medical Association Annual Symposium. Oren and Jimmy's concept, *BeatboxECG*, was chosen from a national pool of over 70 teams. VetPrep gave the team a \$2,500 cash prize to assist them in developing their novel idea. "The Idea" is a competition held exclusively for veterinary students and encourages them to take an entrepreneurial and innovative approach to veterinary medicine. The competition required each team to pitch an idea to a diverse panel of veterinary innovators and professionals who provided supportive critique and then offered prizes to the top three groups.

CVM Associate Professor Dr. Mohammad Mir was recently invited to present his research on hantaviruses at the 9<sup>th</sup> International Virology Congress, held in London. Dr. Mir's presentation was a talk on The Therapeutic Intervention of Hantaviruses Disease.

The CVM Associate Professor has also published a manuscript in the SLAS Discovery. The manuscript reports a novel method that can be used to screen chemical libraries for the identification of antiviral molecules for the therapeutic intervention of viral diseases.
